1. **Dr Rod Fensham** The Biggest Estate on Earth. An ecologists view

Rod Fensham is an ecologist at the Queensland Herbarium and the University of Queensland, and he will present his perspective of the B. Gammage thesis that the Australian landscape has been intimately sculpted by the fire-stick of Aboriginal Australians. In 2011 Bill Gammage published 'The biggest estate on earth: how aborigines made Australia'. The book has won many awards and has profound implications for fire management.

2. **Dr Tom Lewis** Frequent and infrequent fire in wet and dry eucalypt forest: lessons from long-term fire
